Too often we are unaware of the risks associated with defective and storm damaged trees, which can cause personal injury and property damage. Recognizing tree defects or damage and taking proper corrective actions can protect property and save lives. This workshop is designed to provide property owners with information about assessing tree risk and condition. Participants will learn:

- How to identify common tree defects
- How proper structural pruning can prevent storm damage
- How to maintain tree health and condition
- How to find and hire professional arborists to care for your trees

This **FREE** evening program will be taught by Vincent Cotrone, Extension Urban Forester and ISA Certified Arborist with Penn State University. Mr. Cotrone has developed numerous educational programs including the Arborist Short Course which prepares tree workers for the ISA Certification exam, and has presented throughout Pennsylvania on various topics ranging from tree species selection, planting and proper tree pruning practices to establishing shade tree commission, inventorying trees, developing shade tree ordinances, and managing stormwater.
